Moundville Archaeological Park

Coming through Alabama last month, prior to the storms, I found two interesting places to visit. The first is the Moundville Archaeological Park in Tuscaloosa.

Moundville Archaeological Park is 13 miles south of Tuscaloosa, Alabama at Exit 71 off Interstate 20/59. It came through the recent storms unscathed.

Located on the Black Warrior River, National Geographic calls it "The Big Apple of the 14th Century." This once powerful prehistoric community, at its peak, was America's largest city north of Mexico. The Mississippians constructed 28 massive flat-topped earthen pyramids. The largest covers two acres at its base. The small, but exquisite museum has just completed a \$5 million renovation, which includes a

hologram worthy of Disney. There are RV hookups for \$10/night. It's a bit rundown, but I was told funding is in hand to renovate and upgrade that part of the 326-acre park, which is owned by the University of Alabama.

The other place to visit is the Birmingham Museum of Art. The Birmingham Museum of Art is easy to find, just off the Interstate. Admission and parking are free.

The exterior courtyard with a sculpture garden would have been very inviting except for the rain. My energy level gave out after doing the main second floor, so I'm saving the largest collection of Wedgewood outside of England and other joys of the third floor for the next time I'm going through Birmingham.

The museum is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday and noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday. Closed Mondays and major holidays. Free tours are offered Tuesday through Friday at noon and at 2 p.m. on Sundays.

Great Grape Salad from Marcia Schleif SALAD 3 ½ or 4 lbs red grapes (or half red, half green) 4 oz. Sour Cream ¹/₂ cup Sugar 8 oz. cream cheese, softened 1 teaspoon vanilla Slice all of the grapes in half. Cream together the sour cream, cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Mix in grapes and coat well. Topping Note: To make this recipe lower fat and lower sugar, 3/4 cup brown sugar 3/4 cup chopped pecans you may use low fat Sour cream and 1/4 cup Mix brown sugar and pecans. Spread on top of the grape mixture. Splenda Sugar Blend. Also, on the topping, omit the brown sugar and mix the pecans directly into the grape mixture.

> Elephant Stew from the "Christ Church Frederica Cookbook" St. Simons Island, GA



1 Elephant (medium size)

2 Rabbits (optional)

Salt & Pepper to taste

Cut elephant into bite-size pieces (this takes about 2 months). Add enough gravy to cover. Cook over kerosene fire for 4 weeks at 465°. This will serve about 3,800 people. (Great for Pot Luck Supper!)

If more come than expected, the 2 Rabbits may be added....but do this only if necessary. Most people don't like hare in their stew!

Easy Angel Food Dessert from Eileen Disbrow

(2) 20 oz. cans crushed pineapple in juice, drained

- (1) 10¹/₂ oz. angel food cake, cut into 1" cubes
- (2) packages, 1 oz. each, instant vanilla pudding

4 medium, firm bananas, sliced 3 cups cold milk 1 tub, 8 oz. Cool Whip



Cut angel food cake into cubes and place in the bottom of a 13x9 pan. Place drained crushed pineapple in a bowl; gently fold in the sliced bananas. Spoon fruit over cake.

In a bowl, whisk milk and pudding mixes for 2 minutes, let stand for 2 minutes or until soft set. Spread over fruit. Carefully spread Cool Whip topping over pudding. (Optional: sprinkle with chopped pecans or other topping of choice)

Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours. Makes 15 servings.





MEMBER MAINTENANCE TIPS OR THINGS WE LEARN THE HARD WAY

"Unfortunately, RV fires are one of the largest causes of RV loss in America today. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), fire departments, RV repair shops, and insurance carriers estimate there are approximately 6,300 RV fires annually. Deaths resulting from RV fires are estimated at 5 to 20 each year and RV Alliance America statistics show half of fires erupt while the RV is parked."

Never re-enter a burning RV to retrieve anything-GET OUT & STAY OUT!

"While the causes of RV fires vary widely, there are identifiable trends. Engine and electrical fires are consistently the greatest cause of loss. Engine compartments, including electrical, flammable-combustible gases and liquids, are the cause of origin roughly 70 percent of the time.

Tires and brakes are the culprit in almost 20 percent of fires. Some of the worst fires are those caused when one tire of a dual or tandem pair goes flat and then scuffs and ignites, long before the driver feels any change in handling.

At each rest stop, give your tires at least an eyeball check. Remember a pressure gauge reading on hot tires is NOT accurate. Tap duals with a club and listen for a difference in sound; you can often tell if a tire is going soft.

The remaining causes of fires vary widely from faulty generators, fuel leaks, solar power problems, cooking carelessness, propane leaks, spontaneous combustion in damp charcoal, and certainly a range of unknown origins."
