The Electric Slide

Step right foot to right, cross left foot behind right foot, step right foot to right, touch left foot beside right foot, then Step left foot to left, cross right foot behind left foot. Step left foot to left, touch right foot beside left foot Walk back, right foot, right foot, put left heel forward

Step forward on left foot, touch right foot beside left foot, step back on right foot, touch left foot beside right foot Step left foot forward at an angle to turn 1/4 left, scuff right foot to start dance over

Cupid Shuffle

Step right foot to right, step left foot beside right, repeat three more times

Step left foot to left, step right foot beside left foot, repeat three more times

Kick right foot forward, step back beside left foot, kick left foot forward, return beside right foot, repeat right and left kicks With left foot on floor, pivot 1/4 turn left by taking four steps with right foot, then start over

Cowboy Charleston

Touch right toe forward, step on Right foot, touch left toe back, step on left foot, repeat

Tap right toe to right side 2 times, cross right foot behind left foot, step to left on left foot, bring right foot beside left foot Tap left toe to left side 2 times, cross left foot behind right foot, turn 1/4 to right on right foot, step left foot next to right foot

Start over

CHINOOK CHOW—RECIPES FROM THE ROAD

Pineapple and Cheese Casserole

2 twelve oz cans pineapple chunks or tidbits, drained

1 cup grated cheddar cheese

6 tablespoons flour

1/2 to 1 cup sugar

1/2 to 1 cup butter (I tend to use less butter and sugar, but is up to the individual tastes!)

1 sleeve Ritz crackers, crushed

Spread pineapple chunks in baking dish

Combine cheddar, flour and sugar and sprinkle over the pineapple

Spread Ritz crackers over the mixture

Drizzle butter over all.

Bake at 350 degrees for approximately 20 minutes or until bubbly and crisp.

This month: Notices and Reminders

Tire recall: Just a reminder to check your tires: Michelin is recalling one version of a specific size of the Michelin LTX M/S tire. These tires are typically found on such vehicles as commercial light trucks, full-sized heavy duty vans, small RVs and some large pickup trucks. The tires were produced between January 2010 and June 2012. and are Michelin LTX M/S LT 225/75R16 115/112R LRE, DOT sequence B3JH AKEX The tires were fitted as original equipment on some new vehicles and were also sold as new replacement tires. Michelin is issuing the recall because a small number of the tires being recalled experienced tread loss and/or rapid air loss. The website at http://www.michelinman.com/safety-recall.page will show you where to check your tires and how to secure replacement tires.

Rebate for carbon monoxide alarm: At multiple rallies, Tom Jackson has reminded us that the carbon monoxide alarms in our rigs are most likely long past replacement time. There is currently a rebate available for the replacement units, which can be found at safehomeproducts.com, Camping World, Amazon and other retailers. The model that fits most units is 65-542, but check your current alarm for accurate replacement. The rebate form can



be found at http://www.mtidealer.com/images/Online Rebate Form-RV Safe-T-Alert.pdf Propane alarms are also available to replace the one usually located near the floor in the sink area.

Preparations for the Road

The days are counting down to the Elkhart Rally and it's time for me to start planning our trip. I have been trying to decide what to write on for the Trailblazer. Then it hit me, why not explain a little how I decide where to go on a trip, especially when that trip is integrated into a rally.

The first thing that I do is go to a map on the internet and put in Elkhart, Indiana (or my destination town) and then let the system route it for me. I usually like to let it show the different routes that are available. Print the map that is on the computer if you want or just get the map book out. Now if you don't use the internet you can do it with a map and just look at the major towns along your route. Note on the map that the dark blue and light blue are both routes

that the system routed. We can follow one up and the other down but also venture on roads in between and not do interstates, remember that this is only a guide to get started.

Okay, now that we have a general area that we will be in, we can begin to find those special places we want to see. I go back to the internet now and get the travel guides from the states that we will be going through to Elkhart, Indiana. Because I'm working on the internet I can just look at all of them online (and even save them on my device as a PDF if I want).


The States that Terry and I will be going through are Tennessee, Kentucky and Indiana. I start looking through the individual State Travel Guides to see what each state has to offer and what we would be interested in. At this point I am looking at everything and might be led to other sites about interesting places. Now begin to take notes and do this the way you feel most comfortable. I use "Notes" on my computer and copy and paste information directly into it. No pencil and paper for me, I save that for my drawing.

A must for me is visiting my family in the area around Lafayette and Indianapolis. I also want to visit the New Harmony area where my ancestors lived, so will get a little genealogy into the trip too. www.newharmony-in.gov New Harmony is a very interesting little place that was settled in 1814 by the Harmonie Society and is a National Historic Landmark. Harmony State Park Campground, 3451 Harmony State Park Road, GPS: 38.06500, -87.95071 New Harmony, Indiana

This will get me started to plot out my trip. I have put the above in order by state. Try to always make it a different route back so you maximize what all you see. At this stage I'm not exact on the map because I do not have a detailed enough map but you can get an idea of how it works.

Terry and I like to stay at Corp of Engineer Parks and State Parks when available. In this area there are a lot of options for RV Campsites, I personally like to use the app "Allstays Camp and RV" on my Iphone as we are traveling because at this point I never know where we will be when we stop for the night. With the "Allstays Camp and RV" it shows me all of the options available for camping in the area wherever we are. This app also will give me the phone number and make the call to see if space is available, price, etc.



I hope that this will help you to plan your trip in advance a little. Please remember though that even when you plan you need to be open for any exciting options that are presented along the way. Let the trip be an adventure!

TRIP PREPARATION CHECKLIST: In response to the request to share trip planning tools, member Diane Poole has graciously shared her extensive checklist. She says "I print off a new list for each trip, and generally do a walk through to verify that I have items packed, and that there is enough to last for whatever time frame our trip is. The things 'to buy' go on my store list. The list tells me whether I need to buy something, or reminds me that I've stored it in the house somewhere over the winter. Over the years I've deleted some things and added new, depending on what we forgot the last time. We don't need everything every time, but having it on the checklist reminds me when we do need it."
