
And if you are on your way to Washington State....

TAKE A SIDE TRIP TO TUNICA, MS by Diane Cremens













About 25 miles south of Memphis, TN, is the Tunica Resorts Area. In the 1990's, Mississippi approved casinos in poverty stricken Tunica County and the casinos grew out of the cotton fields. Currently there are nine casinos scattered in an area of approximately 10 miles. As you approach Tunica from the north from Memphis on US Highway 61, the first casino you will come upon is Harrah's. Harrah's is the largest and has a Good Sam RV Park for around \$14.00 per night.

If you go southwest from Harrah's on Old Hwy 61, you will come to Bally's and then to Casino Center that consists of the Gold Strike, Horseshoe and the Roadhouse. There are no RV parks affiliated with these casinos and sometimes, especially on weekends, RV parking is prohibited.

To reach the other casinos, travel down Old Hwy 61. Fitz is the only casino located directly on the Mississippi River. It looks like a huge castle and allows overnight RV parking. It is just down the road from Tunica Riverpark and the Tunica Queen boat. The Riverpark was damaged in the floods and is currently closed due to remodeling.

Southwest of the Fitz is the Casino Strip area and Sam's Club, Hollywood, and Resorts, all on Hwy 305. Hollywood and Sam's Town both have RV Parks, although Sam's is still closed from the flooding. All the casino RV parks have full hook-ups, cable, wi-fi and nice restrooms and are quite reasonable.

There is more to do in the Tunica Area besides gambling (and eating buffets). There are three golf courses, Cottonwoods at Harrah's, River Bend Links at the end of Hwy 305 next to Hollywood, and Tunica National, not affiliated with any casino. We have played Tunica National and River Bend Links (temporarily closed due to the flooding). In warmer weather, it is fun to watch the birds and turtles in the ponds. Check their websites for specials.

South of the casino area is the town of Tunica, a small town with some antique shops, an Arena Expo Center and a museum. The Expo Center has concerts, rodeos, trade shows, horse shows, etc. and an RV park. There is a visitor's center south of Harrah's on US 61. It is the start of the Mississippi Blues Trail and has much information about the area. North of the visitor's center is an outlet mall if you would rather part with your money and get something for it!

Isle Royale National Park

Located in Keweenaw County, in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, Isle Royale National Park located near the southern border of Canada, the eastern border of Minnesota, and the northeastern border of Wisconsin.

Travel can be so many different things, but for this Chinook family, we like the wild and natural outdoors with lots of animals. So, Terry and I have proceeded to try to visit all of the National Parks in our beautiful Country. We have visited most of them and so on our dwindling list Isle Royale and Voyagers were left and fairly close together. So they became the destination of our fall trip 2010, planning a big circle that included a lot of destinations along the way.

The park that I'll talk about on this visit is Isle Royale and we accessed it from Grand Portage, MN. Grand Portage is home of the Ojibwe people and reflects their culture, along with beautiful Lake Superior. There is a casino there, but we never visited it because we don't have very good luck when it comes to gambling. The Marina and RV Park is home to boats and campers, but only for 10 sites with full hook-ups and a comfort station with restrooms and showers (not great). Thank goodness for our little Chinook home.



When we arrived they had no spots left, but after talking with the young man in the bait/marina shop; he managed to provide us with the most beautiful spot in the whole area! Right on the water's edge with beavers and otters playing under the docks and building their den. They were busy going out the small inlet, swimming down the shore a little, chomping down a tree and dragging it back to their home. The vista was beautiful and the cove was quiet and still we were all to ourselves.

The only way to visit Isle Royale is to go by boat and we chose the Wenonah. The boat leaves early and there is only one over and back a day (I think). We were at the Windigo side of the island. They have self-guided trails and also a


Ranger guided walk. There isn't anything except a gift shop ,small museum building, and bathrooms; maybe a few cabins for staff but it isn't a luxurious island resort. The kids love it and there were scout troops and a lot of young people. You need to be in really good shape for all of the hiking and primitive camping, but don't be afraid to go for the day trip.



The flora and fauna is great and the boat ride nice, with lots to see. Plan for exposure to sun and heat if it's summer, but it can be cold and rainy too on the boat ride, so be prepared.

One thing that surprised me was that there are a lot of islands on the way out to Isle Royale. There are shipwrecks and a light house too, Lake Superior is a very treacherous body of water. Hope you get to visit, it's not a Yellowstone or Yosemite, but is still worth the visit.

CHINOOK CHOUI-RECIPES FROM THE ROAD

AUTUMN SOUP

1 lb. lean ground beef 1 chopped onion 4 cups water 1 cup, cut up carrots 1 cup, diced celery 1 cup, cubed potato 2 tsps salt 1 tsp Kitchen Bouquet

1/4 tsp pepper 1 bay leaf

1/8 tsp basil 2 cans, 14 1/2 oz., diced Italian Style tomatoes

Cook and stir meat until brown. Drain fat. Cook and stir onions with meat about 5 minutes. Stir in remaining ingredients except tomatoes. Heat to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer 20 minutes. Add tomatoes. Cover and simmer 10 minutes or longer.

Cranberry Pumpkin Bread Taste of Home Magazine



3 cups sugar 3³/₄ cups all-purpose flour 4 eggs

1/2 cup vegetable oil 4 tsp pumpkin pie spice 2 tsp baking soda

1 tsp salt 1 cup chopped walnuts 15 oz. can solid pack pumpkin 2 cups, chopped cranberries

In a large bowl, combine flour, sugar, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda and salt. In another bowl, beat eggs, pumpkin and oil; stir into dry ingredients until just moistened. Fold in cranberries and walnuts. Spoon into 2 greased, 9x5x3 loaf pans. Bake at 350° for 70-80 minutes (test after 65 minutes...). Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan. Freezes well.

Mary Mahoney's Bread Pudding

6 slices day old raisin/cinnamon bread 4 eggs

1 tsp cinnamon 2 TBLS plus 1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup raisins 2 cups milk

2 TBLS butter, melted 1 tsp. vanilla extract

Break bread into small pieces in a 1½ quart baking dish. Sprinkle cinnamon over bread, add raisins and melted butter. Lightly toast bread mixture in the oven at 350°. Once toasted, add mixture of eggs, sugar, milk and vanilla after whisking together well. Bake about 30-40 minutes until solid.











MEMBER MAINTENANCE TIPS OR THINGS WE LEARN THE HARD WAY

HEY, I'M THIRSTY!

With a little extra care your RV will be the source of fun and relaxation for many years. Fluids are the "lifeblood" of our Chinooks. The engine needs adequate fluid to run at its best, just like you do.

Checking all your fluid levels in the engine compartment should be a regular part of your pre-travel routine. Inspect the fluid levels of your vehicle's engine oil, coolant, power steering fluid, transmission fluid, brake fluid and windshield washer fluid. Check your Ford/Chevy owner's manual to familiarize yourself with each reservoir's specific location. Simply check each reservoir level, topping off where needed.

If you use lead acid batteries, be sure to replenish with distilled water; just be careful not to overfill the cells. Sealed batteries are considered 'maintenance free'.

Now and then take a look under your Chinook for signs of any "mystery fluids" on the concrete or ground. Check under the engine, axles and storage compartments. If you've been running the A/C, the fluid may simply be condensation. If the fluid is light green, feels like baby oil and smells sweet, it's probably antifreeze/coolant—harmful to our pets, keep them away. If the fluid has a slight rusty color, or contains rust colored particles, it could indicate that the cooling system has been neglected and you may consider having the cooling system flushed as soon as possible.

Fuel leaks look mostly clear, evaporate quickly and have a distinct odor. Brake fluid leaks can be diagnosed by looking for a clear fluid with the consistency of baby oil that has a faint odor of alcohol. Motor oil tends to puddle on top of the pavement and is slippery fluid, usually brown or black in color. If the mystery fluid is pink or red, it is usually either automatic transmission fluid or power steering fluid, although, some power steering fluids are clear.

If you find a leak, do your best to find the source of the problem. In any case, whether you are a do-it-yourself type, or whether you have a trusted mechanic, do not ignore the problem. Getting problems fixed ASAP will avert further problems down the road!


Help! I Need Fresh Air!
