
Narrated Bus Tour Around Lake



Do what you like doing best: bike, hike, Jeep, sightsee, golf, drive the scenic routes, walk nature's path, relax in gorgeous scenery or seek out backcountry adventure. Your hosts, Lynn and Marian Ewer, have been visiting this area since 1962 and are now part-time residents. Let them arrange a schedule just for you.



For reservations call Portal RV Park at 435-259-6108 by <u>AUGUST 1, 2009</u>. Only ten sites are being held for the Chinook RV Club, so when you register, identify yourself as a Chinook RV Club member. You will be able to cancel your reservation up to 48 hours before arrival so sign up now.

The cost with tax is \$39.29 for each of the five nights. If you would like to drive your Jeep in Horse/Salt Creek Canyon in Canyonlands, send a request with \$5.00 to Canyonlands National Park, Reservation Office, 2282 SW Resource Blvd., Moab, UT 84532. Only ten vehicles are allowed in this canyon a day, and they started taking requests last July. October 7th is the day the group will probably be in that area, but you never have to go with the group. Your hosts will be glad to answer any questions and will send you information on activities if you plan to come.
