

October 12 2013

I. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by President David Shehane at 5:30 PM.

II. Attendance/Quorum: President Shehane declared that we could proceed with the business of the evening as there were enough members present to establish a quorum.

III. 2 Side Bars: Before beginning the meeting President Shehane advised that he would give a short report on two issues. Side bar 1 – With regards to the new Chinook RV being built, he recently spoke with John Chelis of the Wagon Trail Co. In partnership with John Lee of the Country Coach Co., the new improved Chinook Glacier is being built, as we speak, to be finished in December. Next will be the Concourse, then an all new 24 ft on a Mercedes to be finished in February or March of 2014. They also plan on building a coach within the 25-30 feet range on a GM Workhorse chassis sometime in the future. The new factory is at the old Country Coach facility. Side Bar 2 – We are looking into a closer relationship with the Chinook Owners Yahoo Group. They have about 600 members which could be potential Chinook RV Club members for either the East or West RV Club.

IV. Minutes:

The minutes from the General Meeting of September 14, 2012 in Williams, AZ had been published in the Chinook RV Club Road Runner Newsletter for all to read and copies are available if anyone would like to read them now.
