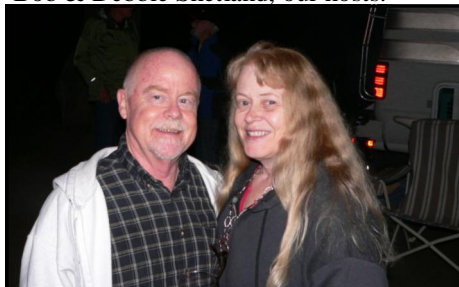

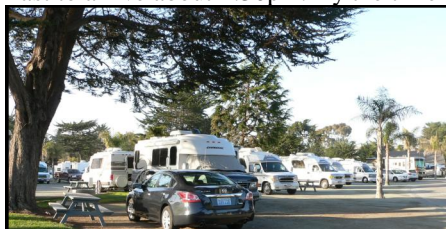


## Pismo Beach , CA Rally held May 29 to June 1, 2014

here told me about a Apple App called "Marine Traffic" that not only tracks ships here, but anywhere in the world. It gives all the information on the ship, size, type, speed, where it left from, and destination. It shows that in real time, so we could see what was coming and approximately when it would be here.

**Monday.** The official start of the rally. Twelve Chinooks are scheduled,

and all had arrived by the 5pm pot-luck in the clubhouse. Another great pot-luck and as usual, too much



food .Al and Lucy entertained us with the "Chinook Ballad" That night, three more cruise ships passed, the last one around 11pm. By that



time, most of us were in bed .

**Tuesday.** A free day, with another pot luck scheduled , but there were some gathered in the clubhouse

for games. The scheduled pot luck was right on time at 5pm. Some left overs, but mostly new dishes, plus a spectacular cake the Jensens brought from town. The weather was great, but actually got a sprinkle of rain. More cruise ships passed in the evening, even though we

**Wednesday.** We had breakfast on our own. Activities for the day were a whale watching expedition on a Zodiac boat that holds 12, and a tour of the fish processing plant at the dock.



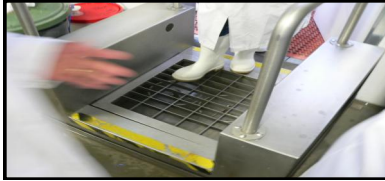
Nine members went on the whale watching trip at 10:00am, and then another nine of us toured the fish processing plant at the dock next door. We all had to dress up in the white smocks, put on white "barn boots" and hair nets and

beard nets for those with a beard. We were led us down to a wash room where we stepped on a boot sprayer to wash off any



contamination. Then washed our hands and



put on rubber gloves. Now we were ready for the tour. There was a machine that in one operation, cut open the salmon, scooped out intestines, bloodline and cleaned the

insides. Then a worker vacuumed out what was left inside the fish, and on to processing.



The fish are packed in Styrofoam boxes, crushed ice placed on top, shipped whole with the heads and tails intact. This plant produces 25 tons of crushed ice per day. Smallest boxes of salmon weighed 65 pounds +/- . The factory is working well below maximum capacity to extend the season for the workers. Even though it was only 11:30 at



end of our tour, there were still 3 hours to go. In the break room there was a pie chart showing production in real time. Here it is:

That evening, all 22 of us gathered at the floating restaurant next to the processing



plant, for a fish (cod) and chips (French fries) dinner. Great service and great food. After dinner, we got our group picture, and

returned to the RV park. There was a full moon that came up behind some trees that made for a beautiful sight and the perfect ending to a wonderful day.



**Thursday** morning we were treated to a pod of Orcas surfacing right in front of



us. That kept us entertained for a while as we watched them surface and dive. Then watched the bald eagle that had a nest somewhere in the trees above us. At 5pm we gathered for our last pot-luck in the clubhouse. Then during dinner, we watched another (our 10th) cruise ship



pass. They come from Vancouver and go to Alaska and then return only to restock and



come up again. The local deer was spotted out on the point of land by the harbor and Wednesday night we watched salmon feeding



in the bay by us. There were all kinds of floating craft that kept up entertained during our stay here. This one barge was really loaded, with vehicles stacked on top.

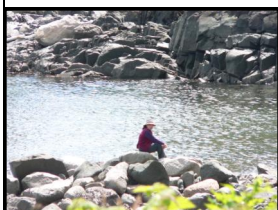

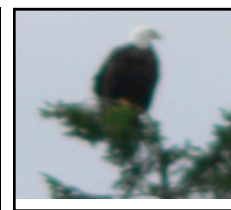
