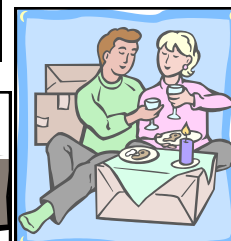
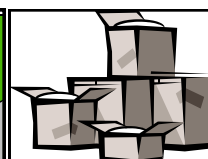
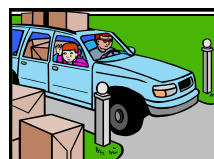
Oregon's only National Park, Crater Lake is also nearby.

## QUINCY, CA. Rally

Held May 23-26, 2013

What a great meet this turned out to be. We had 15 coaches there. The weather cooperated, not being too hot or cold. And a little excitement thrown in for good measure—a nice 5.7 magnitude earthquake, a sprinkle of rain, and a little wind thrown in for good measure.



**Thursday.** The official start of the rally. We gathered during the day, and at 5 pm we had our “meet and greet”. Wine, deli meats and cheeses, rolls, vegetables and fruits. Hosts even provided the utensils to eat with.

He did a great job telling about the area, and we thoroughly enjoyed it. A few took the short 3/4 mile walk into town, and he mentioned several things to see and places to visit or eat. The rest of

we had our first Pot-luck. As usual, there was more food than we could eat, and everything was delicious. (Personally, I thought we were a little short on desserts ). We gathered

of 5 throws. In the evening, we had our BBQ, with everyone bringing their own meats, and cooking was done by our hosts

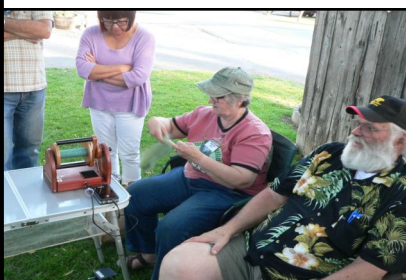


. With a few leftovers and some fresh salads, it made quite a feast. After dinner, we gathered for a group picture, talked into the night, and retired for the evening.

## UPCOMING RALLIES

### Desert Hot Springs, CA (Annual) 4 nights October 9, out October 13, 2013



There was a time not so long ago when Sky Valley Resorts was nothing more than 160 acres of arid land sprouting native vegetation. Back in the 1950's, part owner Tim Manthei's father saw potential in the hot springs. Never did he imagine just how much potential those bubbling underground cauldrons of hot water would one day have. But his son Tim did. After Tim graduated in 1970, he headed to Desert Hot Springs with plans of building an RV park. Within a few months, Sky Valley Resorts was open for business. 40 years later there are two Hot Springs resorts in the Hot Springs area, Sky Valley and Caliente Hot Springs, with space for 1600 RV's and manufactured homes.

Desert Hot Springs is world famous for its therapeutic hot Mineral Waters. At Caliente Springs we cool down the water before it's piped into the pools and hot tubs.

Amenities include: Large Mineral Water covered pool (two temperatures): Four Mineral Water hot tubs with different temperatures; Two Saunas (one each in the men and women showers); Fitness Room, Library; Shuffleboard; Mail Center; Horseshoes; Billiards and Ping-Pong room; Tennis courts, Plenty of clean bathrooms and showers; WiFi and Cable TV; Nine hole golf course and driving range (but grass will be brown because season is over).

## Recipes

### MAPLE PECAN REFRIGERATOR COOKIES

Yield about 40 cookies

1 C softened butter	1/2 C sugar.	
3 Tbsp real maple syrup (Not pancake syrup)		1 large egg yolk
1/2 tsp vanilla extract		1/2 tsp maple extract
2 C flour		1 1/2C chopped pecans

1. Beat butter for 3 minutes or until creamy. Beat in sugar gradually. Add syrup, egg yolk and extracts, beat well. Stir in flour and pecans.
2. Divide dough in half and shape into logs 2 inches in diameter. Wrap in plastic wrap or parchment and refrigerate until firm.
3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
4. Cut logs into 1/2 inch thick rounds, Arrange on greased cookie sheets. Bake for 18 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.
