Juesday 4-27-2010

plain waffles, OJ, and coffee. A lady from the Paso Robles Chamber of Commerce gave a presen-

tation of the history and in-sights of the



area. At 9:45 Ole, Barbara and I went to pick up the 15 passenger van in town, and went back, & picked up most of the group that wanted to go wine tasting. We crammed 15 into the van and another 7 in Jensen's SUV and headed out. First stop was the Castoro Cellars. This is a beautifully landscaped winery and vineyard. Lots a flowers in bloom, neatly arranged rows of vines, all nicely manicured. Out back, in a fenced in area was Harley, their 16 year old pot bellied pig. He was laying on his side, minding his own business, leisurely munching on the ankle high weeds. He finally did



manage to get to his feet, and move, allaying our fear that he was almost dead. Many wines were tasted, several bottles purchased, and we were on our way once more.

Our next stop was Summer Wood Winery and Inn. Another beautifully landscaped area. The inside floor of the tasting room was beautiful and unusual. There were squares of 4 large off-white stone tiles, framed in with 8" wide dark stained wood planks in a symmetrical pattern. Several more wines sampled and bottles purchased, and then back into the van and SUV, and on to our lunch date in Templeton.

We arrived at McPhee's Grill, where they had the back room all set up and waiting for us. We had a great lunch there, some had stuffed salmon, others a huge pulled pork sandwich with fries. These platters were huge and there was plenty to eat.



As we left, we found that the Chocolate Factory next door was closing, and the landlord was giving away all of the stock of chocolate. He handed everyone who went in a paper lunch sack, and we could help ourselves to anything in the store. Most of us left with the bags at least half full. What a find and treat! A great way to top off an excellent lunch.

The next stop was Eberle Winery, for more wine tasting, a group picture and a tour of



the winery caves where they store barrels of wine. Our guide said they spent about million on the cave, but made it up within 2 years on savings on air conditioning and loss from evaporation because the barrels need humidity. He said they used to lose about 17 bottles per barrel in the old above ground storage due to air conditioning drying out the



Pot Luck Recipes

Black Beans "n" Pumpkin Chili

Yield 10 servings (2-1/2 qts)

1 medium onion, chopped

1 medium sweet yellow pepper, chopped

3 garlic cloves, minced

2 Tablespoons olive oil

3 C chicken broth

2 cans (15 oz ea) blk beans rinsed/drained

1 can (15 oz) solid-pack pumpkin

and cook on low for 4-5 hours or until heated through.

1 can (14-1/2oz) diced tomatoes, undrained In a large skillet, sauté the onion, yellow pepper & garlic in oil until tender. Transfer to a 5 quart slow cooker; stir in the remaining ingredients. Cover

Yield: 11 servings

1 can (14-1/2oz) diced tomatoes, undrained 1 can (6 oz) tomato paste

1 can (14-1/2oz) beef or chicken broth

2 med green peppers, chopped 1 med onion, chopped 3 celery ribs, chopped 5 garlic cloves, minced 3 tsp dried parsley flakes 2 tsp dried basil

1-1/2 tsp dried oregano 1-1/4 tsp salt

1/2 tsp cayenne pepper 1/2 tsp hot pepper sauce

1 lb boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1" cubes

1 lb smoked sausage, halved and cut into 1/4" slices

1/2 lb uncooked medium shrimp, peeled and deveined

Hot cooked rice

In a 5 qt slow cooker, combine the tomatoes, broth and tomato paste. Stir in the green peppers, onion, celery, garlic and seasonings. Stir in chicken and sausage.

Cover and cook on low for 4 hours or until chicken is tender. Stir in shrimp. Cover and cook 15-30 minutes longer or until shrimp turn pink. Serve with rice.

1 package (9 oz) tortellini cheese

40 Pimento stuffed olives

40 large black olives

3/4 C Italian salad dressing

40 slices pepperoni

40 slices hard salami

Cook tortellini according to package directions.

Seal and refrigerate for 4 hours, or overnight.

Drain and discard dressing.

Use short skewers. Thread a stuffed olive, folded pepperoni slice, tortellini, folded salami, tortellini and a black olive. Enjoy

Mixed Nut Bars

Preheat oven to 350

CRUST:

1/2 cup butter

1 1/2 cups flour

1/2 tsp salt

3/4 cup powdered sugar

1 tsp vanilla

Mix and pat into 9x13 pan. Bake 10 minutes

GLAZE:

1/2 cup white corn syrup

2 Tablespoons butter

1 cup butterscotch chips

Melt in microwave and mix well. It is best to melt the chips according to package directions and then add the butter and corn syrup and heat it again.

Pour 1 pound $(2 \frac{1}{2} - 3 \text{ cups})$ mixed nuts on cooked crust. The nuts are available big jars at Costco. If you want the bars to taste more like a PayDay candybar, use a nut mixture with peanuts in it.

Pour glaze over top and bake for 6-8 minutes.

Chinese Cashew Chicken Casserole

Yield: 8 servings.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

4 chicken breast halves, boneless, skinless, 1/2-inch cubes

2 cup rice, cooked

1 cup celery, diced

8 ounces fresh mushrooms, sliced

2 tablespoons onion, chopped

1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice

1 can cream of chicken soup

1/2 cup mayonnaise

1/2 cup sour cream

1 can (8-ounces) water chestnuts, drained and slivered

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, melted

1/2 cup salted cashew nuts

1 cup crushed corn flakes

Mix all ingredients together except butter, nuts and cornflakes.

Transfer to a greased 9x13-inch casserole dish.

Combine melted butter, nuts and corn flakes. Sprinkle on top of casserole.

Bake in preheated oven for 35 minutes.
