## Message from the President

Having just returned from our great 2013 rally in Desert Hot Springs, I am energized by the enthusiasm that our members are putting into the planning and putting on of great activities for the benefit of all of our members. A great thanks to Al and Eva for their work putting together a great annual rally! And the reports from our Rally VP's are exciting. There are great mini-rallies and rallies to come in the next year along with the new "Flash" rallies, all giving our members more opportunities and options to get out with their Chinooks, see more places, and meet more people. The original founder of Country Coach has taken over the bankrupt CC assets and is presently in the parts and upgrade business for their prior coaches.

It is one of the only administrative tasks of the club and becomes bothersome to extend and extend the printing just to try to get everybody into the roster. Please sit down right now and send your dues check in....still only \$35 a year per coach.

I for one am looking forward to just seeing my coach again after a long hiatus at the repair shop.....see you all at next year's rallies!

#### So what the heck is a "Flash Rally"?

Flash Rallies are scheduled in between the mini rallies and the annual rally. Conceivably there could be two or three flash rallies scheduled simultaneously in different areas, so that more members could attend. Some of us like a few more rallies, especially in certain geographic areas, like Oregon, Washington and far Northern California. Perhaps the Southern California, Arizona group would like the same.

## Sylvia Speak (VP Rallies)

The club has rallies so that members can gather, socialize, and learn more about their rigs from more "experienced" owners and those with special expertise. The Chinook RV Club has a schedule of at least three "mini" rallies and one annual rally every year.

I feel that because of the large geographic area we handle and also harder economic times, many of us would like to gather more often, but closer to home. Personally, I can't afford to fill up my Chinook several times on the way to and from a mini rally in addition to the fees for the camping. I'm sure I'm not alone in finding that I need to stay within a "camping budget".

Secondly, membership and rallies are closely linked. Younger owners are now buying many Chinooks and those potential members still work a 9-5 job, making attendance at rallies more difficult. By having more rallies in different locations throughout our area, it would be easier for someone to attend, since travel would be only a few hours instead of days, in some cases, to regularly scheduled mini or annual rallies in far away locations.

Mini rally and annual rally hosts and hostesses are reimbursed for their RV space, given a limited budget to purchase food and other items such as; travel means, decorations, prizes, etc. "Hosts" for flash rallies are not.

So why would I want to schedule a flash rally instead of a Mini or Annual Rally? Because you can be as little or as much involved as you'd like in preparation. Most RV parks require a certain number of rigs to give a discounted rate and a flash rally may only have a few rigs. You can have members make their own arrangements with the park or you can chose to handle it yourself. That's another difference. A flash rally can be as simple as letting me know that you're going to a great or new RV Park and will be there between XX and XX dates, and if anyone would like to join you, to let you know. I can then let the membership know by email, or newsletter if advance time permits, so those interested could let you know. A couple of years ago the Raudman's did that when they were heading out to the desert for some camping and welcomed anyone wanting to join them.

Lastly, many Chinook owners enjoy their rigs and the comfort they bring. How relaxing to go enjoy the outdoors while having the comforts of home and in such a beautiful RV! But organizing and coordinating rally, preparations and hosting are not for you? Consider a Flash Rally and enjoy all of those things mentioned and the company of some like minded Chinookers!




